

New look for city centre, main beach

Caloundra's city centre and main beach is in for a "whole new look", according to Caloundra Mall consultants Pfeiffer Marais.

It was not clear whether the redevelopment of Bulcock Street and Bulcock Beach involved a formal mall like Brisbane or a partial pedestrian mall, which encouraged tourists to drive through the city centre.

A Pfeiffer Marais spokesman said the Landsborough Shire Council would meet tomorrow to discuss ideas put forward by the people of Caloundra for the full or partial mall.

The \$5million facelift covers footpaths, timber wharf with small passenger terminal, restaurant, surf life savers club and

extensive landscaping for Bulcock Beach. Paved and covered paths, material umbrellas, clock tower, water fountains and "a lot of trees" are planned for the main street.

The \$1million stage 1 — covering part of the Bulcock Beach upgrading, road works, street lighting and paving — is expected to be completed by June 1988. The remaining stages are expected to be started by the 1988/89 financial year.

"The redevelopment will add a new life to Caloundra city in both attracting the tourist element and bringing the local people back into the city centre," the spokesman said.

Caloundra is shedding its sleepy family-holiday image. The seaside resort promoters have set about attracting all holiday makers to "the best beaches in the world".

Caloundra Chamber of Commerce and Industry executive officer, Kathy Ely, said Caloundra was traditionally considered a family resort, but the town had come of age.

"We have a lot to offer year-round holiday makers," she said.

"People like to go to a happening place for a holiday. Caloundra has a wealth of attractions like Australia's most modern race track.

"We are within easy reach of all the attractions of the Sunshine Coast. We

don't want to be brash with development and tourist attractions, we aim to retain that village and street environment, that will always be here.

"We want to keep that friendly, relaxed atmosphere that people look for on holidays.

"We have kept up with the times, we have room to develop with all of those beaches. There is no need for people to go further than Caloundra, it has the best beaches, the best attractions, the best facilities."

Caloundra's population swells from 18,000 to 55,000 over the Christmas ew Year vacation.

The city is surrounded by seven beaches — Golden Beach, Bulcock Beach, Kings Beach, Dicky Beach, Shelly Beach, Moifat

Beach and Currimundi Lakes.

More than 15 motels (average \$40-a-double a night) and 12 caravan camping parks (average \$8 to \$18 a night) accommodate the influx of tourists.

Attractions include the Corbould Park's four-day Christmas racing carnival and races each Saturday, Captain Cook's Endeavour replica at Golden Beach, World of Matches at Currimundi, Black Hole Waterslide at Currimundi, and the Queensland Air Museum on Caloundra Road.

Mrs Ely said Caloundra was "the" spot for Brisbane day trippers.

"You can leave Brisbane, find a park and be on the beach in 50 minutes. "And for those lucky enough to live here it works in reverse, we have the advantage of living so near a major city."
