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## **The Club has completed its sixty-first season.**

### **MISSION STATEMENT**

To achieve the highest level in the delivery of Aquatic Safety, Rescue and Emergency Care with the support of volunteer members within a family based environment.

### **ANNUAL REPORT**

The Club is a professional Life Saving organisation and has three main activities, which are:-

- Maintaining Beach Patrols on Bulcock Beach, Caloundra;
- Training and development of Members and the Public in Life Saving techniques; &
- Increase Participation & Volunteering.

The present Clubhouse was constructed in 1989 and is located adjacent to Bulcock Beach, at the western end of the beach. The Clubhouse is constructed on stumps/piles with half the Clubhouse elevated above the beach.

Equipment of the Club is modern and contains all the necessary items of Life Saving Club equipment.

The main rescue equipment are the Inflatable Rescue Boats (IRB), paddle boards and first aid equipment.

The Club maintains Beach Patrols during weekends and public holidays over the summer months of the year (September through to May).

Membership of the Club is open for application to any member of the public willing to assist the Club in whatever manner they are able (to help the Club achieve its mission) and the bulk of membership is people aged 7 to 70 years.



## PRESIDENT'S REPORT

It was pleasing that the Club held its 60<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Function on Sunday 8<sup>th</sup> July 2014. As all members will know, McClelland and Associates published two history books (by Mr James R McClelland and Mr Paul T Seto) on the Club to coincide with the 60<sup>th</sup> Function. An electronic PDF copy is available for purchase at a cost of \$15. It is understood that James McClelland is continuing his historical works with the Club, and presently cataloguing and listing the Club membership and patrols records.

Over the last 10 years there has been some wonderful growth in the club. I am sure that those members, who have been involved in the Club for a few years, have seen some great improvements in the equipment in the club house.

We held our annual Awards Function this season on Saturday 2 May 2015 at Grand Pacific BreakFee Resort, who is kind sponsors. The function was well attended with approximately fifty members and family attending.

## CLUB CAPTAIN'S REPORT

### **Patrols**

I am pleased to report that Beach Patrols were conducted on every allotted day throughout the season. It is also pleasing to report the following new Patrol Captains

- Patricia Barry
- Paul Clarke
- Gary Smith
- Henry Webb

The Clubs is implementing the following new processes for new members for next season:

- Annual re-accreditation is to be completed by 31/10/2015;
- New re-accreditation logs books are being produced for next season; and
- Re-accreditation will include an update with respect to induction policies (code of conduct, policies, procedures, etc).

The following processes are intended to be adopted for new members for next season:

- Three member sign-on days will be held (September, December & Late January) - these will be advertised on the Clubhouse;
- Bronze Courses will be conducted over three weeks following the sign-on days (three one day courses which will include water and theory sessions);
- An assessment will be completed at the end of the course;
- When new members successfully pass the course, they will be given their uniform;
- Members will be unable to patrol until they have completed the assessment and obtained their Blue Card; and
- Successfully completing the course will be a pre-requisite to membership.

### **Equipment**

The Club purchased the following new equipment this season:

- Base Digital Radio on SLSA digital frequency
- Two digital handheld radios on SLSA digital frequency
- A new Yamaha 25 HP outboard motor
- Two new shade tents, first aid walls and a spare roof

Unfortunately the SLSA digital radio channel is not performing to expectation with poor quality signals, and frequent drop outs. However the RLSS Simplex channel seems to work well.

### **Sport**

Club members have undertaken limited activities in pool lifesaving sport this season. Paul Barry and Rob Reid attended the Australian Pool Life Saving Championships in Hobart (January 2015) as officials. Jeannie Baxter-Reid attended as manager of the Qld Team.

### **Clubhouse**

During the season, the girl's dorm was split into a smaller dorm room with two beds, and an office. This has allowed the Club's records to be stored in a more appropriate manner, and allow the club to have a proper office – which allow us to print (training books, etc) and store uniforms appropriately.

## CHIEF INSTRUCTOR'S REPORT

I write this report for the 2014-15 season with mixed feelings. On one hand there is a strong sense of regret and on the other an equally, perhaps greater, sense of pride in my period as Chief Instructor for this wonderful Club.

To address the first I have to apologise to the membership for my lack of recent direct involvement in the day to day workings of the Club. There are always many excuses as to why people fail to meet promises. I have many. Over the past few seasons I have seen the Club grow stronger by the continued commitment of a small number of members. I may have been available for advice but have shown little recent leadership in my portfolio.

Which brings me to the second of my feelings, that of pride.

If the committee will indulge me, in what will be my last report during this period as Chief Instructor, I would like to reminisce about some of the Club's achievements in the area of training and competition, particularly those in which I have had a more direct involvement.

Highest on the list of personal achievements has been the involvement of the Club in the Master's events at the World Lifesaving Championships. It started small in 2008 when Paul Barry, Brad Clegg, Jim Connelly and I travelled to Berlin, with one silver medal and culminated at the Championships in Adelaide in 2012 where a much larger team medalled in all but one of the Line Throw events we took part in. The trip to Egypt for the 2010 Championships will be hard to beat as a Club tour. For me winning the gold medal with Brad in the Line Throw was only beaten, as a memory, by Paul Barry and Robbie Schwartz winning their bronze in the Board Rescue.

Our participation in these events underscores the nature of our Club. We are not the biggest, but I would not be so quick to say that we are not the best, Club on the Coast. We understand our limitations and train and patrol within those to achieve the absolute best we can. Our record as a patrolling club is second to none. Our ability as a Club to provide a patrolling service is reliant on our ability to train our members to the highest standard possible to be the best they can be individually. The list of people responsible for this training is extensive particularly as much of it occurs as an adjunct to our patrols and all our patrol captains are to be applauded for the work they do in equipping our juniors with practical lifesaving skills and challenging our seniors to add to theirs.

The work done by Paul and Lynda Barry with our Junior Lifeguard program is the backbone of the Club and provides so many children with an opportunity to learn lifesaving basics and compete between themselves. We have had many graduates from this program join the patrolling roster and the work over the past decade is now seeing some of them move into leadership positions within the Club.

As members will be aware, the Society trialled a new 're-accreditation' system this year that has allowed members to re-accredit their qualifications (awards) in a more efficient manner.

Both Deputies (Samantha Barry and Henry Webb) have completed significant work with upgrading their skills (both completed a Cert IV TAE 40110 – Trainer & Assessor) and have been very active in conducting training courses.

I would also like to make mention of the work of Patricia Barry with people at the other end of their lives. When the Royal Life Saving Society introduced the Grey Medallion to provide lifesaving instruction to people who may have missed the opportunity during their schools years, Patricia put up her hand and has led the way across Australia in the delivery of this program. I have been able to assist her in providing some instruction on skills and will never cease to be amazed at the achievements her students make, again when challenged to do their personal best – whatever that may be.

Patricia and Tony Barry have also continued their free community course in basic resuscitation, defibrillator use and basic first aid.

In conclusion, it has been a privilege to have been the Chief Instructor of our Club. I hope that members continue to challenge themselves and to take the opportunities that arise to extend their skills through lifesaving competition or undertaking higher awards.

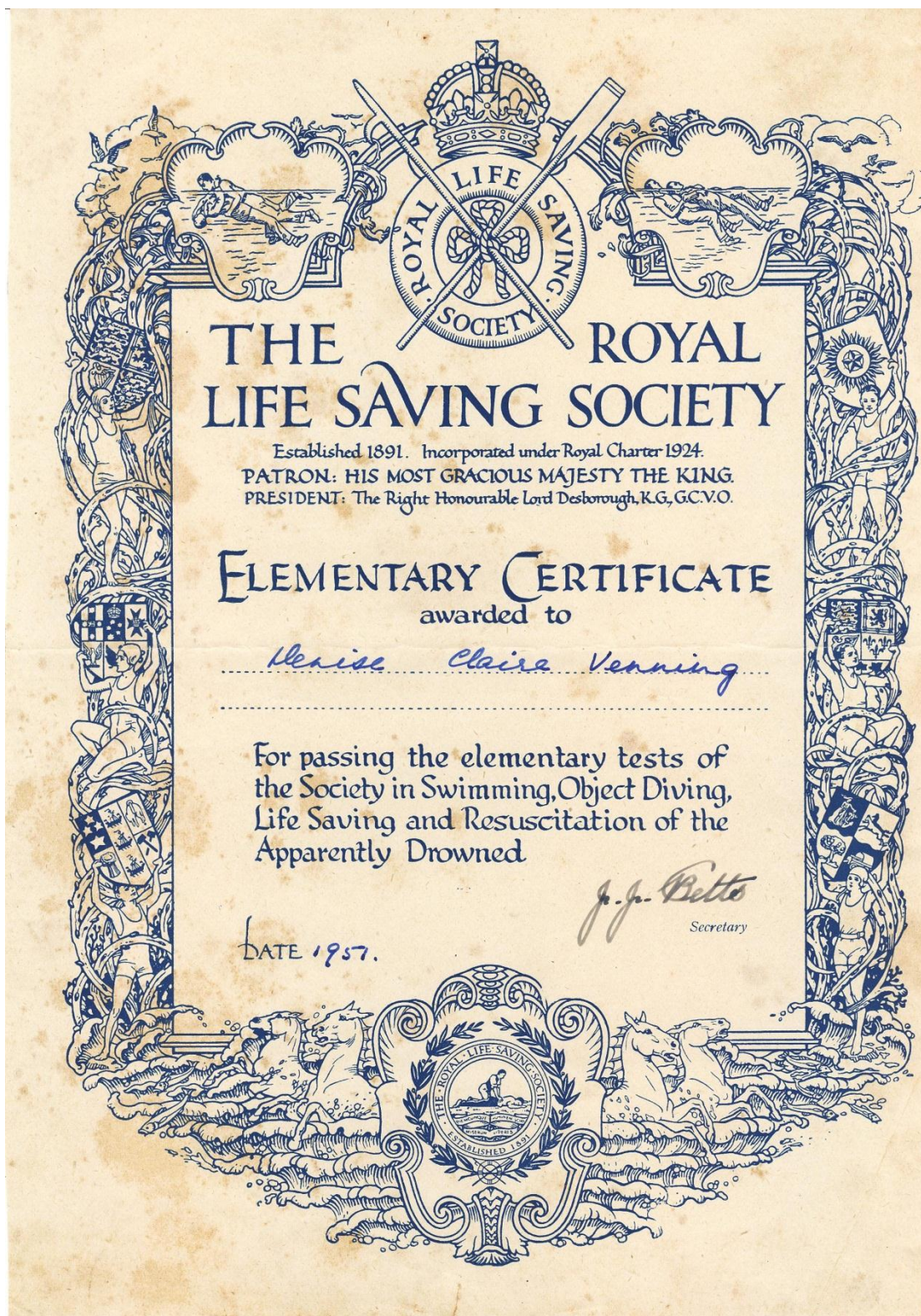
I congratulate the Club and all of its members for their achievements this year and look forward to being involved with many more into the future.

This season the Club patrolled Bulcock Beach, Caloundra, weekends from 20 September 2014 to 26 April 2015 (21 Sept 2013 to 27 April 2014 last season).

## PATROLLING

Patrols are conducted on all weekends and public holidays during the summer season and are overseen by:

- \* Club officials (Regular unannounced inspections carried out);
- \* The Royal Life Saving Society (members of the Combined Clubs Committee); and
- \* Surf Life Saving (SLSA Duty Officers visit the Club regularly and provide guidance and advice).

The Club holds a Patrol Service Agreement with Sunshine Coast Regional Council, wherein the Club agrees to patrol the beach from September School Holidays through to the end of April, during designated hours. Council Beach Life Guards utilise the Club facilities and equipment for weekday beach patrols. Since October 2012, Sunshine Coast Regional Council have contracted (outsourced) their Lifeguard Service to Surf Life Saving Qld, who now performs the weekday lifeguard service.

The aforementioned groups above ensure the quality of patrols is maintained to the highest standard. Every patrol has an allocated Patrol Captain who must be qualified for control of all of the patrol functions (i.e.: IRB, Radio, First Aid, etc)

Every member, while on patrol, must wear the Club patrol uniform, which consists of red shorts, yellow shirt (indicating 'Beach Patrol') and a quartered red and yellow skull cap.

All First aid cases are continued to be treated in the first aid room, unless the patient is located away from the Clubhouse, in which case they are treated at the scene.

Local Laws advisory – the Club records incidents where advice is given to the public in respect to local law matters including:

- \* Dogs within the bathing reserve;
- \* Fishing within the bathing reserve;
- \* Smoking between the flags; and
- \* Boats/Jet Skis in the bathing reserve.

## JUNIOR LIFEGUARD PROGRAM

The Club commenced its Junior Life Guard Program (similar to Nippers) in 2002 and continued it again this season. The Program is a fun environment where games and competitions are used to teach the children:-

- Water Safety;
- Basic Rescue Techniques;
- Safe Swimming Habits;
- Basic Resuscitation; and
- Team work & responsibility.

The program is conducted by members of the Club and all sessions (and children) are logged and tracked. Children progress through an introductory period of basic water safety; and will then progress through the 'Swim & Survive' (*Love 2 Swim*) series of awards. This progression would be expected to take between 1 and 4 years depending of the child's age and abilities. After the Swim & Survive awards, Junior Lifeguards are named as Cadet Lifeguards, and they aim for the 'Bronze Star' award, which is a rescue award similar to the Bronze Medallion. The target age for Bronze Star is 12 years old, and once Junior Lifeguards obtain their Bronze Star, they can assist with beach patrol duties. As the program develops, new strands have been added, to cater for the changing demographics of membership. In the 2007/08 season a Rookie Strand was added to the program, which includes members from 13/14 to 16 years.

### **Strands**

**Junior** Aged 6 to 11 years old. Swim and Survive Series.

**Cadet** Aged 11 to 12 years old. Bronze Star Award.

**Rookie** Aged 13/14 to 16 years old. They are encouraged to complete the Bronze Medallion in the year they turn 14. Once members complete their Bronze Medallion they are able to assist beach patrols as a qualified member.

The Junior Lifeguard Program conducts two training sessions each week:-

- Sunday morning at 8.00am (2 x 1 hour session) on Bulcock Beach

## TREASURER'S REPORT

I wish to advise that the Clubs finances remain sound. For a number of reasons the Club operated at a surplus this financial year. These include:

- Most costs of the Annual Awards Dinner being met by Sponsors, hence after taking into account the fundraising efforts, the function ran at a profit
- Strong Beach Collections from our donation tin (increased by \$1,000 from previous season)
- An additional funding of \$5,000 from the Federal Government (shown in donations)
- A good control of operations expenditure, which is down \$11,000 on the previous season
- \$1,000 grant from CoTA for a Grey Medallion course to be run in 2015/2016 year

The Clubs overall income was reduced, however the clubs expenditure was well controlled resulting in an operating surplus. It is pleasing that no significant unforeseen expenditure has been encountered this season which can have a detrimental effect of the finances.

The Clubs Foundation fund was closed during the season and the sum of \$135,000 was transferred to the entity Life Saving Support Services Inc (LSSS), who has governance and controls around those funds. Importantly, the funds are held by LSSS in an Affiliated Account in the Clubs name.

The Committee has placed the boat, Lady Ithaca, for sale; however as at the end of July 2015, no sale has yet eventuated. The majority of the sale proceeds from the boat will be directed to the Club's Affiliate Account at LSSS.

In respect to next season, we are projecting a general increase in costs, particularly for things such as insurance, utilities and club house maintenance.

I wish to advise that we were successful in the following grants:

\$2,000 – Sunshine Coast Council – for Shade Tents

\$1,000 – Council of the Ageing – Grey Medallion Course (to be held in 2015/2016 season)

\$5,000 – Federal Government, Department of Health – Equipment Grant

The Club also received its annual patrol support of \$24,000 from the Queensland Government, Department of Community Safety.

I also report the following individual significant donations:

\$500 Paul Barry and \$1,000 (name withheld – parent of senior member)

Beach collections for the year were extremely well supported. This could be due to the ingenuity of Mr Gary Smith, who dressed a Pool Rescue Bob in life jacket and helmet. The donation tin raised \$3,288 for the year, which is a record and has really helped the Clubs finances.

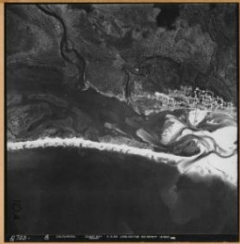
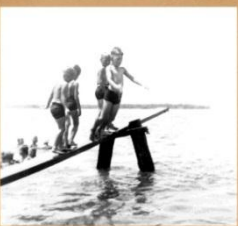
In fact, the tents serve multiple purposes for the local community. They are used to shelter the club's
