ANNUAL REPORT

The Club is a professional Life Saving organisation and has three main activities, which are:-

- Maintaining Beach Patrols on Bulcock Beach, Caloundra;
- Training and development of Members and the Public in Life Saving techniques; and
- Increase Participation & Volunteering.

The present Clubhouse was constructed in 1989 and is located adjacent to Bulcock Beach, at the western end of the beach. The Clubhouse is constructed on stumps/piles with half the Clubhouse elevated above the beach.

Equipment of the Club is modern and contains all the necessary items of Life Saving Club equipment.

The main rescue equipment is the Inflatable Rescue Boats (IRB), rescue/paddle boards, rescue tubes and first aid equipment.

The Club maintains Beach Patrols during weekends and public holidays over the summer months of the year (September through to May).

Membership of the Club is open for application to any member of the public willing to assist the Club in whatever manner they are able to help the Club achieve its mission. The bulk of memberships are people aged 7 to 80 years.

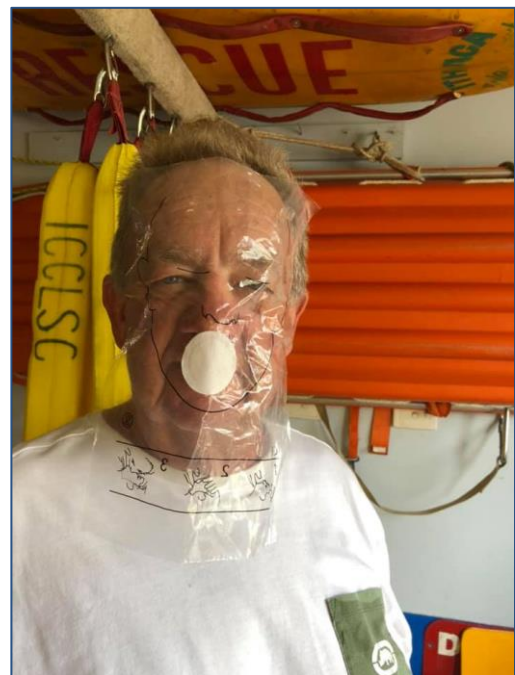

GREY MEDALLION COURSE

Seventy seniors completed the Grey Medallion run by the Club in two events held in July and August 2018. Once again, the Club was able to offer the course free to the local community thanks to funding as part of Seniors Week by the Council of the Ageing and support by Accountants United and Break Free Resorts. The first Grey Medallion run by the Club ten years ago had eight participants. Since then, it has grown in such popularity among the locals that now two events need to be held to meet the demand. 2018 was the second year the Club provided two free courses in a year. Club members gave very generously of their out of season time to assist in running both of the events, as facilitators for a range of sessions and life guards.

The following comment from one participant says so much about the quality, professionalism and dedication of our life savers: *"I have participated in CPR and First Aid every year for the past 25 years at my workplace and without doubt the two days I spent doing the Grey Medallion have been much more valuable and left me considerably more confident. The hands-on activities using the defibrillators, baby, child and adult dummies with attached technical gauges were especially valuable as we were guided to improve our skills. The trainers made the two days fly past quickly without a hint of boredom. That is saying something for two precious weekend days for myself, a fulltime worker. We have had our first grandchildrenso much of what we covered on the weekend will be of enormous value when we have them stay with us."*

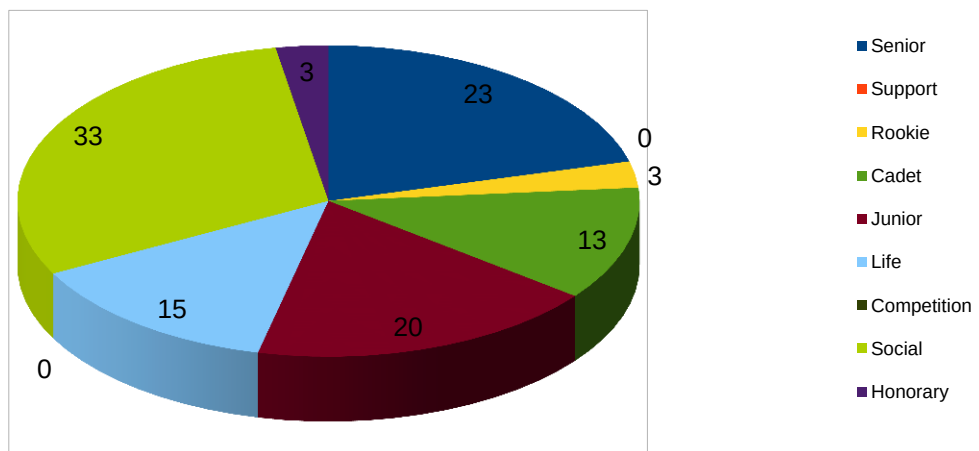

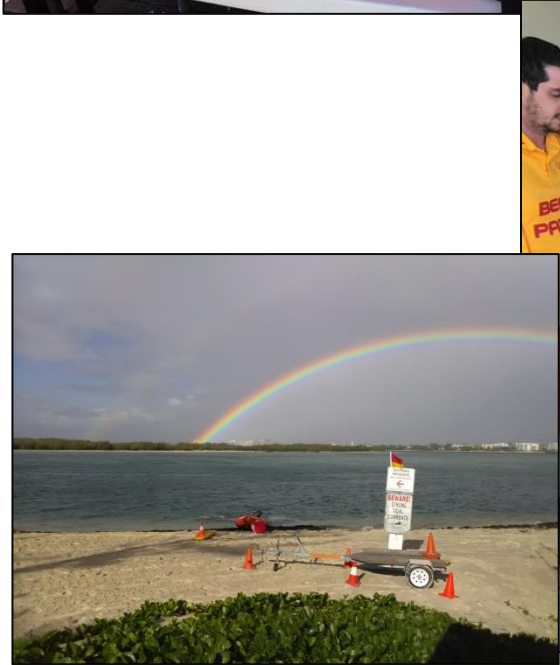
Membership has increased from 93 members last season to 110 for the 2018-2019 season.

CLUB CAPTAIN'S REPORT

It's been another great season I am pleased to say that all of our patrol requirements were fulfilled. It was an extremely busy season with 12 new members joining this year.

This is the first season that we have fully used the electronic reporting system for all logs, including patrol, incidents etc. Thank you to everyone for their patience and enthusiasm in learning the new system. The system has saved a lot of time and also produced some very professional reports that we use in grant writing and to the Queensland Fire and Emergency Services. This has also proved a valuable statistical tool for things such as identifying what are our majority rescues and first aids, and where they take place.

This season our small club contributed to the safety of 76,219 people, being on the beach in the water or on craft. This is a huge number of people to look after in a season. Our members also treated 146 people for first aid. There were many types of injuries, from the very minor cuts and stings, to more major situations involving paramedics such as stonefish puncture wounds, dislocations and also a major CPR case. I would like to congratulate Cosimo Ronconi for this successful outcome.

Our members also rescued 59 patrons. Most of these rescues were in the IRB, and mostly swimmers going to and from Bribie getting caught in the current.

Total patrol hours for the season was 4,514 which is a staggering amount for such a small club. If we divide the total number of hours by the patrol opening hours of 734 this gives us the average number of members on patrol – 6. I know sometimes there was more and sometimes less, but this is a good average figure and operationally a good number of people to have on each patrol.

The club continued the community education with a couple of talks about CPR and defibs. The club again conducted two very successful Grey Medallion Courses.

Royal Life Saving Society Qld also held their Black Tie Ball in April 2019. Our club was well represented with two tables filled with members and partners. I am sure that everyone would agree that a good night was had by all.

Apart from the society honours given that night, I would like to make note of a couple of other awards that were presented at the Ball, or will be shortly to members:

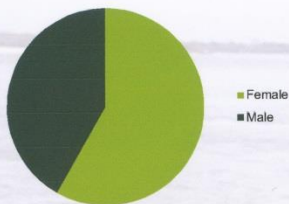

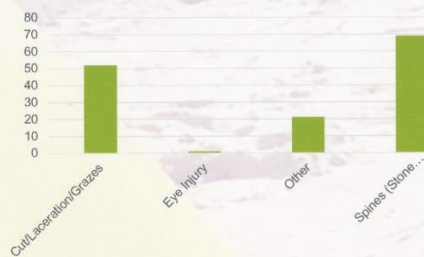
Gender

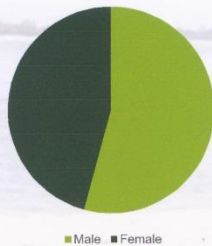

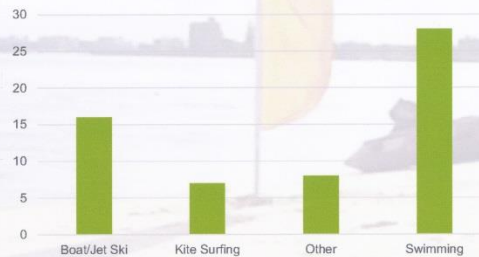

PATROLLING

Patrols are conducted on all weekends and public holidays during the summer season and are overseen by:

- * Club officials (Regular unannounced inspections carried out);
- * The Royal Life Saving Society (members of the Combined Clubs Committee); and
- * Surf Life Saving (SLSA Duty Officers visit the Club regularly and provide guidance and advice).

The Club holds a Patrol Service Agreement with Sunshine Coast Regional Council, wherein the Club agrees to patrol the beach from September School Holidays through to the beginning of May, during designated hours. Council Beach Life Guards (subcontracted to Surf Life Saving Queensland, since October 2012) utilise the Club facilities and equipment for weekday beach patrols. The aforementioned groups ensure the quality of patrols is maintained to the highest standard. Every patrol has an allocated Patrol Captain who must be qualified for control of all of the patrol functions (i.e.: IRB, Radio, First Aid, etc)

Every patrol member must wear the Club patrol uniform, which consists of red shorts, yellow shirt (indicating 'Beach Patrol') and a quartered red and yellow skull cap, whilst on patrol.

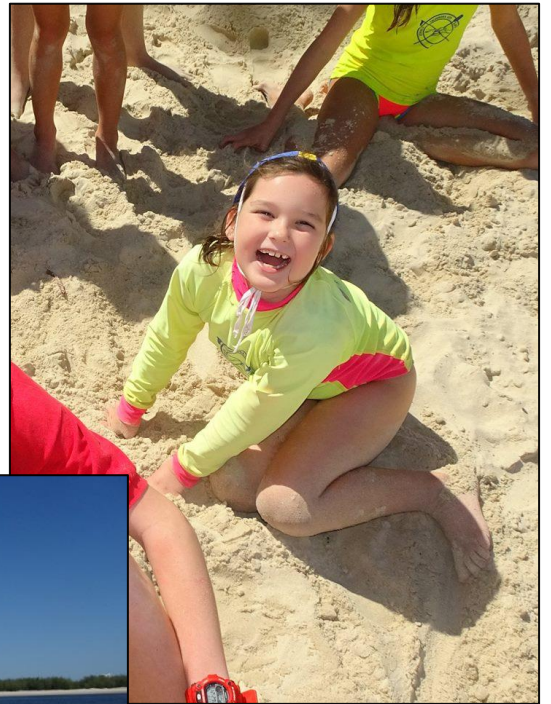

All First aid cases are continued to be treated in the first aid room, unless the patient is located away from the Clubhouse, in which case they are treated at the scene.

Local Laws advisory – the Club records incidents where advice is given to the public in respect to local law matters including:

- * Dogs within the bathing reserve;
- * Fishing within the bathing reserve;
- * Smoking between the flags; and
- * Boats/Jet Skis in the bathing reserve.





JUNIOR LIFEGUARD PROGRAM

The Club commenced its Junior Life Guard Program (similar to Nippers) in 2002 and continued it again this season. The Program is a fun environment where games and competitions are used to teach the children:-

- Water Safety;
- Basic Rescue Techniques;
- Safe Swimming Habits;
- Basic Resuscitation; and
- Team work & responsibility.

The program is conducted by members of the Club and all sessions (and children) are logged and tracked. Children progress through an introductory period of basic water safety; and will then progress through the 'Swim & Survive' (*Love 2 Swim*) series of awards. This progression would be expected to take between 1 and 4 years depending of the child's age and abilities. After the Swim & Survive awards, Junior Lifeguards are named as Cadet Lifeguards, and they aim for the 'Bronze Star' award, which is a rescue award just below the Bronze Medallion. The target age for Bronze Star is 12 years old, and once Junior Lifeguards obtain their Bronze Star, they can assist with beach patrol duties. As the program develops, new strands have been added, to cater for the changing demographics of membership. In the 2007/08 season a Rookie Strand was added to the program, which includes members from 13/14 to 16 years.

Strands:

Junior Aged 6 to 11 years old. Swim and Survive Series.

Cadet Aged 11 to 12 years old. Bronze Star Award.

Rookie Aged 13/14 to 16 years old. They are encouraged to complete the Bronze Medallion in the year they turn 14. Once members complete their Bronze Medallion they are able to assist beach patrols as a qualified member.

The Junior Lifeguard Program conducts two training sessions each week:-

- Sunday morning at 8.00am (2 x 1 hour session) on Bulcock Beach

On the 10th June 2019 the Governor-General announced the awarding of the Member of the Order of Australia (AM) to John on the Queen's Official Birthday.

John has been RLSSQ longest serving President and has been actively involved in Ithaca-Caloundra Life Saving Club since joining in 1964.

John has been involved in all aspects of Royal Life Saving at club, state, national and international levels, volunteering his time on committees, clubs, and sport and to manage the organisation.

He has been involved in Club (patrols and management), Sport (as an athlete, manager and official), training and instructing, fundraising, and as an active committee member on committees from club involvement, through to state and national engagement.



AUSTRALIAN BRAVERY MEDAL (BM)

The Bravery Medal (BM) is awarded for acts of bravery in hazardous circumstances. Jim and Hugh have been awarded the Bravery Medal, which is the third highest in the Australian Bravery system of five awards. About 1,349 Bravery Medals have been issued since its creation in 1975.

The brothers were awarded the Bravery Medal from a significant rescue they completed in 1974, when they were 15 and 16 years old.

James and Hugh, then members of the Ithaca-Caloundra City Life Saving Club, became aware of two young girls being swept out to sea. The brothers quickly ran along the beach to gain closer access to the girls, who were using small boogie boards.

Despite not being trained for surf rescues, they entered the choppy surf and made their way in the washing machine-like conditions towards the two girls. As they reached the girls, the group was swept across the Caloundra Bar and out towards open sea. They were then dumped and pushed underwater by the cyclonic conditions, and the girls lost hold of their boogie boards. On several occasions they were separated, forcing the brothers to relocate them in the treacherous conditions.
