ANNUAL REPORT

The Club is a professional Life Saving organisation and has three main activities, which are:-

- Maintaining Beach Patrols on Bulcock Beach, Caloundra;
- Training and development of Members and the Public in Life Saving techniques; and
- Increase Participation & Volunteering.

The present Clubhouse was constructed in 1989 and is located adjacent to Bulcock Beach, at the western end of the beach. The Clubhouse is constructed on stumps/piles with half the Clubhouse elevated above the beach.

Equipment of the Club is modern and contains all the necessary items of Life Saving Club equipment.

The main rescue equipment is the Inflatable Rescue Boats (IRB), rescue/paddle boards, rescue tubes and first aid equipment.

The Club maintains Beach Patrols during weekends and public holidays over the summer months of the year (September through to May).

Membership of the Club is open for application to any member of the public willing to assist the Club in whatever manner they are able to help the Club achieve its mission. The bulk of memberships are people aged 7 to 80 years.

The last season has presented some challenges for the Club and our members, but we all came through it.

Thanks to our new members for your dedication to training and learning new things and about our patrol operations.

We are only a very small club and we do rely on all members to commit to patrols. Thank you to all members for your dedication in a difficult season.

Patrols are the main focus for the club however we do a number of other activities throughout the season. I have listed these below:

- Junior Lifeguard training
- Public awareness courses to community groups
- Grey Medallion
- Migrant Beach Program
- Fundraising via twilight markets
- Maintaining compliance issues
- Corresponding with various government and other agencies
- Grant and report writing
- Meetings
- Auditing

These are all done in addition to patrols so, a very big thank you to the members who have played a part in any of these activities. It is always good to get our name out in the community in a positive way.

Membership

Unfortunately, our patrol membership is extremely low and we really only have about 14 members who regularly patrol. There are also a few members not returning for the next season. With this in mind, the Management Committee has started a plan to attract new members.

We are having an Open Day on Saturday 2 September 2023, where radio station 91.1 hot FM will be broadcasting from our clubhouse between 10am and 1pm. A letterbox drop has been planned for the local area, and radio advertising in the week prior to the event. Although patrols will not have started, we are asking members to come along and talk to people and assist with demonstrations to attract new members.

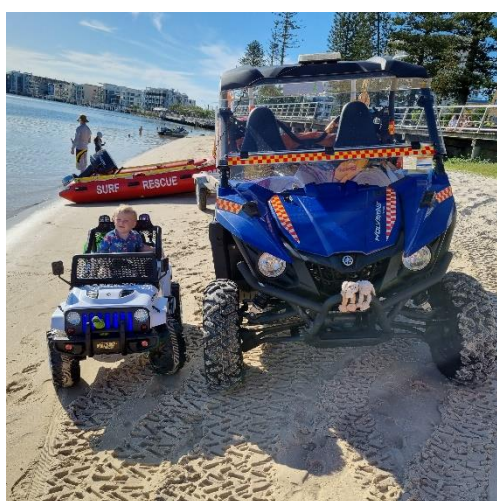

As you can see from the above table, all of our figures (except rescues) have dramatically increased from the previous season. This is exceptional especially given the reduced number of patrol members that we have. Some of the main areas that we have almost doubled in numbers are:

- Preventative actions
- First aid
- Population figures

The main reason for this is the changing conditions with the Caloundra Bar. This has seen our members responding to increased number of first aid cases (cuts) from the rocks at Happy Valley. Unfortunately, signage in the area has not deterred beach patrons from swimming or walking in this area and being injured.

This season also saw two very serious incidents. Firstly, on the 22nd January 2023, late in the afternoon, our patrol team responded to the notification that someone (27-year-old female) had been pulled from the water near the rocks between Happy Valley and Kings Beach. Our team were some of the first on scene and were vital. The patrol team consisted of Paul B (lead co-ordinator) and Abigail in the IRB, Lynda and Izzie in the ATV and Patricia and Tony manning the patrol deck. There were many people to assist in the situation from our club members, Mets club members, paramedics, a doctor, off duty paramedic, duty officer, life savers from other clubs, police etc. All efforts were made to revive her but unfortunately the young lady could not be saved despite our best endeavours. This has been recorded as a drowning. CPR was performed for 45 minutes and the defibrillator was deployed. A full debrief was held after the incident, with QAS and Surf Life Saving. Thank you to all involved in the day.

The second incident, only four days later on Australia Day (26 January 2023), and late in the afternoon, a 35-year-old male suffered a serious spinal injury outside the flags at the Eastern end of Bulcock Beach. The father of two young children dived onto a sandbank to retrieve something for his son. He was treated for spinal injuries by the patrol team – Jim (PC), Izzie, Paul B, Lynda, (all on beach) Patricia and Tony (manning deck). We were also grateful to some members of the public (off duty lifeguard and life savers, doctor, nurse etc) even general people looking after the children for the upset wife. Paramedics transported him to Sunshine Coast University Hospital, and later flown to Royal Brisbane and Women's Hospital. Thanks again to those involved again.

We hope that some of these Junior Lifeguards continue on with us as patrolling members.

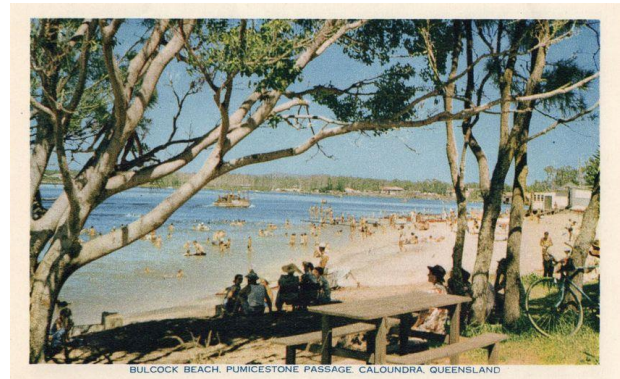

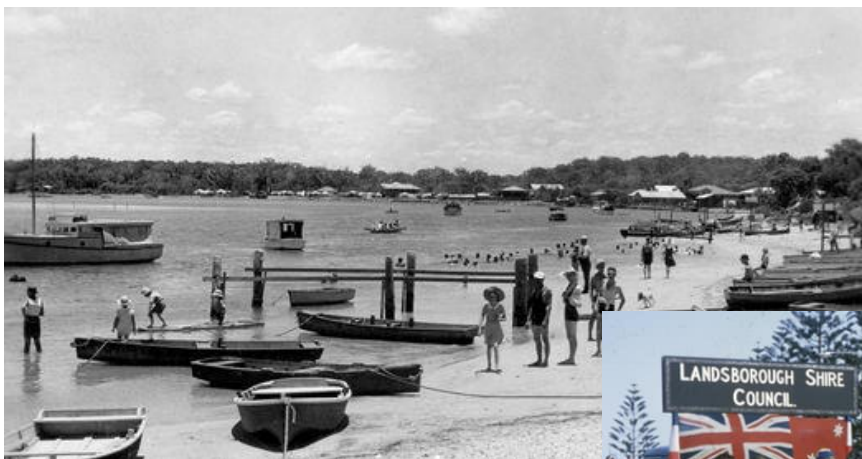

PATROLLING

Patrols are conducted on all weekends and public holidays during the summer season and are overseen by:

- * Club officials (Regular unannounced inspections carried out);
- * The Royal Life Saving Society (members of the Combined Clubs Committee); and
- * Surf Life Saving (SLSA Duty Officers visit the Club regularly and provide guidance and advice).

The Club holds a Patrol Service Agreement with Sunshine Coast Regional Council, wherein the Club agrees to patrol the beach from September School Holidays through to the beginning of May, during designated hours. Council Beach Life Guards (subcontracted to Surf Life Saving Queensland, since October 2012) utilise the Club facilities and equipment for weekday beach patrols. The aforementioned groups ensure the quality of patrols is maintained to the highest standard. Every patrol has an allocated Patrol Captain who must be qualified for control of all of the patrol functions (i.e.: IRB, Radio, First Aid, etc)

Every patrol member must wear the Club patrol uniform, which consists of red shorts, yellow shirt (indicating 'Beach Patrol') and a quartered red and yellow skull cap, whilst on patrol.

All First aid cases are continued to be treated in the first aid room, unless the patient is located away from the Clubhouse, in which case they are treated at the scene.

Local Laws advisory – the Club records incidents where advice is given to the public in respect to local law matters including:

- * Dogs within the bathing reserve;
- * Fishing within the bathing reserve;
- * Smoking between the flags; and
- * Boats/Jet Skis in the bathing reserve.

Migrant Learn to Swim Program

The Club has been delighted to be involved with this over a few years, which has now this has been taken over from Sunshine Coast Council by Royal Life Saving Society Queensland. Each program has six sessions and is run at local pools around the coast. The program has a beach familiarisation session for the participants, many of whom may never have been to a beach before or entered the sea. Our sessions this year were during November and March.

During the two-hour session, Ithaca trainers and members take the participants on a guided beach walk to discuss signs, safety, tides, rips and currents. This is followed by showing how to enter and enjoy the water with or without aids such as noodles or lifejackets. We often find that our new Australians are reticent, and need lots of encouragement, but the beach is ideal for learners now and they end up having lots of fun in the shallows. We also find time to cover how to call for an ambulance and some very simple dry rescue techniques and CPR.

Our Plan B program is for occasions when the weather does not allow us to work outside. We cover similar topics with presentations, videos, etc. and do a longer CPR session.

Club members Doug, Heather, Katelyn, Patricia, Paul and Tony have been involved with this program and all say how much they have enjoyed working with our new Australians showing them how to have fun safely in a beach environment.

Grey Medallion

The Grey Medallion has faced some challenging times with Covid, and in spite of some hiccups was able to run one program in the 2021-2022 season with thirty participants. This has always been a popular and well-liked program with locals, but lack of print media now makes advertising it far more challenging.

We are very grateful to Jim McClelland of Accountants United for their funding to help run this course. The sponsorship of Breakfree Grand Pacific for the event is also very much appreciated.

Very many thanks go to all the Club members who supported this two-day event, teaching local residents about water skills, dry rescue, how to act in emergency situations, CPR, Defib and First Aid.

JUNIOR LIFEGUARD PROGRAM

The Club commenced its Junior Life Guard Program (similar to Nippers) in 2002 and continued it again this season. The Program is a fun environment where games and competitions are used to teach the children: -

- Water Safety;
- Basic Rescue Techniques;
- Safe Swimming Habits;
- Basic Resuscitation; and
- Team work & responsibility.

The program is conducted by members of the Club and all sessions (and children) are logged and tracked. Children progress through an introductory period of basic water safety; and will then progress through the 'Swim & Survive' (*Love 2 Swim*) series of awards. This progression would be expected to take between 1 and 4 years depending of the child's age and abilities. After the Swim & Survive awards, Junior Lifeguards are named as Cadet Lifeguards, and they aim for the 'Bronze Star' award, which is a rescue award just below the Bronze Medallion. The target age for Bronze Star is 12 years old, and once Junior Lifeguards obtain their Bronze Star, they can assist with beach patrol duties. As the program develops, new strands have been added, to cater for the changing demographics of membership. In the 2007/08 season a Rookie Strand was added to the program, which includes members from 13/14 to 16 years.

Strands:

Junior Aged 6 to 11 years old. Swim and Survive Series.

Cadet Aged 11 to 12 years old. Bronze Star Award.

Rookie Aged 13/14 to 16 years old. They are encouraged to complete the Bronze Medallion in the year they turn 14. Once members complete their Bronze Medallion, they are able to assist beach patrols as a qualified member.

The Junior Lifeguard Program conducts two training sessions each week: -

- Sunday morning at 8.00am (2 x 1 hour session) on Bulcock Beach

You're never too old for life-saving

*When British couple **Patricia and Tony Barry** arrived from the UK in 1982 to make their home in Caloundra, one of the first things they did was to join the Ithaca - Caloundra City Royal Life Saving Club – patrolling Bulcock Beach. And 40 years later, they are still doing it - but have taken traditional life-saving a step further.*



While still volunteering their beach-patrolling skills at weekends, they run special two-day weekend courses each year on how to respond in an emergency at home, perhaps in a family pool – but especially when looking after children.

The Grey Medallion course, offered through the Royal Life Saving Society Queensland, is a water safety and lifesaving skills initiative for older adults covering water safety knowledge, resuscitation and defibrillator, aquatic exercise and personal survival skills. It used to run for two hours a week over eight weeks, but the Barry's adapted the program to be run on a weekend. They are the only people offering the course on the coast.

Patricia explains: "I would say that the Grey Medallion grew out of realising what we perceived was needed locally. We adapted the course for our local audience.

"We cover familiarising children and pools for grandparents, the importance of teaching kids how to get out of a pool and how to float, before teaching them how to jump in and swim.

"We teach how to rescue people from a pool without putting yourself in danger, simple first aid, how to deal with our local marine stings and a lot of 'water wise' information as well," she adds.

Patricia says Tony was always a "fantastic swimmer", while she was an "aquaphobe". She recalls: "I would sit on the side and watch others having fun but was too scared to go in. He gave me the confidence to learn how to swim and, through patience and encouragement, got me in the water.

"I was determined my kids wouldn't be like me. At three months old, we took them to the pool in the UK to learn how to swim. They became really good swimmers."

Patricia went on to teach swimming. The primary school where she taught had the proud record of every child being able to swim at least 10 yards by the time they went to secondary school. "Pretty unusual for the UK," she suggests. "I felt that every child should be able to save themselves, even if they weren't a great swimmer."

The Barry's children were involved in lifesaving in England – which is how they became involved themselves.

She says the Caloundra club has a very active and involved group of over 55s who drive the 'rubber duckie', perform rescues, always working as a team. Tony is the oldest member at 80.

The community-minded duo also run courses for bodies corporate and feels every shopping centre and entertainment venue should have a defibrillator – and for people to know where it is and how to use it. "We carry one in our boat. It's not hard to use. However, it isn't the magic bullet. You have to be able to do CPR together with using a defibrillator."

The Grey Medallion courses are sponsored by BreakFree Grand Pacific Resort. They cost \$5 per person and are usually held over two weekends in August.
